**AN ORDER AMENDING EXECUTIVE ORDER 2020-2 TO ALLOW THE LONG
HOLLOW GOLF COURSE AND CLUBHOUSE TO REOPEN TO THE PUBLIC BUT
CONTINUING THE CLOSURE OF ALL OTHER PUBLIC BUILDINGS**

May 5, 2020

WHEREAS, Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) is a respiratory disease caused by the SARS-Co V-2 virus that can result in mild or severe symptoms, including fever, cough, and shortness of breath, and can lead to serious illness or death, particularly in the case of older adults and persons with serious chronic medical conditions;

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is frequently spread through close contact between persons and respiratory transmission; and

WHEREAS, the spread and identification of additional cases of COVID-19 in Tennessee is likely to continue, and therefore, taking proactive steps to prevent a substantial risk to public health and safety is paramount; and

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, pursuant to the authority granted by Tenn. Code Ann. § 58-2-107, the Governor of Tennessee, Bill Lee, issued Executive Order No. 14, declaring a state of emergency to facilitate the response to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States, Donald J. Trump, declared a national state of emergency with respect to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, a Proclamation of State of Emergency was issued for the City of Gallatin on March 17, 2020, the City Council ratified the Proclamation by unanimous vote on March 17, 2020; and the state of emergency has been extended by executive orders on March 24, 2020, March 31, 2020, April 7, 2020, April 14, 2020 April 21, 2020, April 28, 2020, and May 5, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on March 30, 2020, pursuant to the authority granted by Tenn. Code Ann. § 58-2-107, the Governor of Tennessee, Bill Lee, issued Executive Order Nos. 21 and 22, limiting non-essential services and gatherings and urging Tennesseans to stay home unless engaging in essential services to limit exposure and spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on April 13, 2020, pursuant to the authority granted by Tenn. Code Ann. § 58-2-107, the Governor of Tennessee, Bill Lee, issued Executive Order No. 27, extending temporary social distancing and stay-at-home provisions of Executive Order Nos. 17, 21, 22 and 23 until April 30, 2020 to preserve and increase the containment of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on April 28, 2020 Governor Lee issued Executive Order No. 30, An Order Allowing Tennesseans to Return to Work Safely While Encouraging Continued Adherence to Health Guidelines to Limit the Spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, the City of Gallatin believes it is in the best interests of the citizens to begin slowly reopening its facilities and believes it is now appropriate and safe to reopen the municipal golf course, Long Hollow Golf Course and clubhouse.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Paige Brown, the Mayor of the City of Gallatin, by virtue of the power vested in me under the City's Municipal Code Section 7-27, City of Gallatin Resolution No. R2003-19, and other applicable law, hereby ORDER as follows:

1. Effective Thursday, May 7, 2020, the Long Hollow Golf Course and clubhouse shall reopen to the public.
2. The City encourages all golfers and/or visitors to abide by CDC guidelines and guidance set out by Governor Lee to protect the health and safety of Tennesseans.
3. Golfers must abide by all rules and regulations established by the Gallatin Parks and Recreation Department to limit the spread of the virus and to protect the health and safety of citizens and City employees.
4. This Order shall remain in effect until further Executive Order of the Mayor.


