Fried Pies

FOR THE FILLING:

In a large non-stick pan on medium heat, add butter, apples, cinnamon, nutmeg, lemon zest and a pinch of salt. Cook until the apples are slightly tender.

In a measuring cup, add the sugar, cornstarch and lemon juice. Fill with warm water to the 1 cup line. Whisk until everything is dissolved. Turn up the heat to the apples and slowly add the liquid to the pan. Stir until the liquid thickens. Remove to a bowl and refrigerate.

FOR THE PIES:

1. Preheat at least 2 inches of oil in a heavy pot or filled deep fryer to 375°F.
2. Cut 3-4 circles out of each pie crust. Remove the chilled filling from the refrigerator and scoop filling onto one half of each circle, leaving a 1-inch border around the edges. Close by folding the unfilled side over the filled side and pulling the top edges down to meet the bottom. Seal using water between the edges and fold over or pinch around the edges or use a fork.
3. Fry pies in batches, allowing the oil to rest and stay at 350°F. Flip if needed until golden brown, about 4 to 6 minutes. Remove and place on a paper towel, and immediately sprinkle with cinnamon sugar or powdered sugar, if desired.

Filling

3 Tablespoons salted butter

3 Golden Delicious apples, peeled

1/2 Teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/4 Teaspoon fresh ground nutmeg

Zest of 1 lemon

Kosher salt

1/2 Cup sugar

1/4 Cup cornstarch

2 Teaspoons fresh lemon juice

Peanut oil, for frying

2 Refrigerated, rolled pie crusts

Cinnamon or powdered sugar for dusting
